* Simon started at the University of Wolverhampton, UK in May 2017 as a Lecturer in Conservation Genetics. Previous to working at the University of Wolverhampton he was based at Reaseheath College, UK where he was a Lecturer in Animal Management. Simon is also a Scientific Associate at the Natural History Museum, London; an Associate Member of the Island Biodiversity and Conservation Centre of the University of Seychelles; and an Associate Editor for Herpetology Notes.

Simon's research interests lie in the study of evolution, ecology and conservation of reptiles and amphibians. He uses a mixture of laboratory and fieldwork techniques to address questions pertaining to these areas of research as models. Most of his current research focuses on species occurring primarily within Latin America, Seychelles, New Guinea and Australia.
